







## 1.0 Background and Commentary

The Population and Housing Census is the most representative form of enumeration since it covers as many people and variables as possible. It is the total enumeration of households throughout the country. The census is carried out after every ten (10) years in Botswana. This report covers indicators and counts of the 2011 census and makes comparisons, in some instances, with the previous census of 2001. There are two types of enumeration methods. One is the De Jure type and the other is the De Facto. The De Jure method refers to the enumeration of population according to usual residence. It excludes visitors but includes absent residents. The De Facto method, on the other hand, refers to the enumeration of population according to where one spent the census night. It includes visitors but excludes absent residents.

The 2011 Population and Housing Census used the De Facto enumeration. An important aspect about the 2011 census is its wide disaggregation of information by important variables of sex, gender and locality, among others. The disaggregation forms the basis of this report. The report presents information on localities that have 500 or more inhabitants.

### 1.1 Background to the Report

This report was necessitated by the need for disaggregated data at all levels. Statistics Botswana, with the assistance of the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), undertook work on producing geographically disaggregated and gender sensitive information.

### 1.2 Importance of the Report

Demographic and socio-demographic information is critical in the development efforts of a country. The tendency has been to produce national averages to represent the situation of all people within the country. Hence, data at the district and locality level have not been fully published and used by the localities even when available. This masked the wide disparities in demographic, health and other socio-economic indicators within the country. The outlook of these have, therefore, been overlooked hence conditions of large sections of the communities have remained largely unknown.


## 2.0 Population Distribution

Table 1 attached below shows that during the 2011 Population and Housing Census, the highest proportion (28.5 percent) of Kweneng East's population was in Molepolole village. It may be noted that this is the district's headquarters. This was followed by Mogoditshane and Thamaga at 22.8 percent and 9 percent respectively. Other villages in the district with significant population proportions include Mmopane, Gabane, Kopong, Metsimothabe, Mmankgodi, Lentsweletau and Kumakwane. The rest of the villages contributed less than 2 percent each to the total district population.

### 2.1 District Population Structure

The pyramid for Kweneng East Sub District (see Chart 1) shows the structure of a young population, broad based and gradually thinning with increasing age. Although the structure gradually decreases with age, it shows some gaps, particularly for ages 15-19. The population pyramid then shows a pronounced bulge around ages 20-29. This may be due to the fact that the enumeration was done while schools were open and Kweneng East has senior secondary schools and some tertiary institutions, which have a high number of youths.

Fig 2 (a and b): Kweneng East District Age-Sex Structure, 2001 and 2011




The sex ratio of Kweneng East is 95.2 percent, which is not very different from the national ratio of 95.5 percent. The majority of the population in this district are in the broad age group of 0 to 44 years. Due to its proximity to Gaborone, it does follow that most of the population will mostly be those in the working age category. The largest age group in this district is the under-five age group (0-4), at 11.4 percent of the total population, followed by age group 25-29(11.3 percent) and age groups 20-24 and 5-9 at 11.1 percent and 10.1 percent respectively.

## 3.0 Youth

Youth population refers to those aged 18 to 35 years. This population contributed 37 percent to the total population. Since Kweneng East is close to the capital city of Gaborone, some villages have a high number of youths and fewer elderly people. For instance, 50.2 percent of Mogoditshane population was in the 18-35 age group while the elderly contributed less than 10 percent. A number of other villages in close proximity to the city had over 40 percent of their population in this age category.

### 3.2 The Elderly

The elderly refers to the population aged 65 and over. The chart above shows that in Kweneng East, only villages which are a bit far from Gaborone such as Mahetlwe had more than 10 percent of their population in the elderly category. All other villages had less than 10 percent of their population in the elderly category.

### 3.2 Population Growth


Population growth refers to the change that occurs within a population due to the effects of births, deaths and migration (natural increase).

Although the district is close to Gaborone, generally it experienced a modest growth of 3.07 percent per annum between 2001 and 2011. The highest growth rate (35.3 percent) was experienced in Gakuto. This growth may be related to the incorporation of some localities from lands into a village. However some villages experienced negative growth. These include Lentsweletau, Mahetlwe and Lephephe. A negative growth is usually due to outward migration, which is normally due to lack of employment opportunities in an area.

### 3.3 Population Projections

The computation of these projections is based on the component method, which takes into account the assumed future behaviour of fertility, mortality and migration.

### 4.0 Orphan-hood


Orphan-hood refers to children aged below 18, who have either mother dead, father dead or both parents dead.

Table 19 shows that the highest number (11,207) of orphans are those who had their father deceased, followed by those with mother deceased (4,764). Furthermore, 2,159 children had both parents deceased.

### 6.0 Literacy levels

Estimation of literacy rate was based on population aged 10 years and above who had completed standard four or above. Those were assumed to be literate and used to estimate literacy rate. Generally, Kweneng East had high proportions of people who are literate. This may be due to the high number of younger people who are highly educated.


**Figure 5: Literacy Levels by Village**



### 7.0 Religion

Table 6 shows that most people (59.7 percent) in Kweneng West are affiliated to Christianity. Also, a significant proportion (29.7 percent) had no religion, followed by those who follow Badimo at 9.6 percent. All other religious affiliations contributed less than one percent each.


**Figure 6: Distribution of the Population by Religion**



### 8.0 Marital Status

The data on Table 7 below shows that those who were "never" married had the highest proportion of 55.9 percent, followed by those who were married at 19.7 percent. It is also worth noting that those who were living together contributed a significant proportion at 19.3 percent. Other forms of marriage such as separated and divorced contributed marginal proportions of less than 2 percent each.


**Figure 7: Distribution of the Population by Marital Status**



### 9.0 Labour Force

Unemployment in Kweneng East, as shown through Table 10, averages 11.8 percent and 9.7 percent for males and females respectively. However, there are some localities which seem to be severely hit by unemployment. These villages include Tloaneng, which had an unemployment rate of over 22.9 percent for females, followed by Kubung at 22.6 percent and 15.9 percent for females and males respectively. However some localities in the district recorded low unemployment rates (less than 5 percent). These included Shadishadi, Ramaphatle and Gakgatla. The general rate of unemployment in the district is 13.8 percent.

## 10.0 Disability


Disability refers to incapacities as a result of physical or mental deficiencies such as bodily abnormalities, defects and impairments. Impairments are defects of structure or functions of the body which give rise to personal inability to perform necessary activities.

Table 18, (attached), shows that the most common (1.1 percent) type of disability in Kweneng East recorded in the 2011 PHC was defect of seeing in 1 or 2 eyes. This was followed by defects of hearing in 1 or 2 ears at 0.5 percent. Also, the least common (below 0 percent) type of disability was inability to speak.

## 11.0 Household Size

The average household size in Kweneng East Sub District was 3.9 persons per household. Overall, the household size seems to be averaging four persons in all villages in the district except for Mokolodi and Ledumadumane, which had an average of 7.5 persons and 6.8 persons respectively.

**Figure 9: Average Household Size by Village by Village in Kweneng East District 2011**




## 12.0 Access to Portable Water

Availability of safe drinking is an indicator of quality of life. It is therefore a priority of the government to provide all the inhabitants of the country with safe drinking water.


**Figure 10: Distribution of Households by Access to Water in Kweneng East District 2011**

Figure 10 below shows that the majority of the households (51.6 percent) in Kweneng East were using piped water outdoors, while piped water indoors was used by only 23.2 percent. Moreover, 13.2 percent of the households were using communal tap. It is further indicated that there was a small proportion (less than 3 percent) of the households that were getting their water from a borehole, dam, stream, tanker or well, among others. The overall access to improved water source was 93.9 percent.

## 13.0 Sources of Fuel for Lighting

During the 2011 PHC, the source of fuel for lighting was measured at household level. The data revealed that most households (57.7 percent) in the district were using the electricity grid for lighting. This was followed by households that used paraffin and candle at 29.8 percent and 8.5 percent respectively. A small proportion of the households used wood. All other sources of fuel contributed less than one percent each.


**Figure 11: Distribution of Households by Source of Fuel for Lighting in Kweneng East District 2011**



## 14.0 Sources of Fuel for Cooking


**Figure 12: Distribution of Households by Source of Fuel for Cooking in Kweneng East District 2011**

Figure 12 below shows that 49.4 percent of the households used gas (LPG) for cooking. The second highest proportion (30.9 percent) of the households used wood, followed by households which used the electricity grid and paraffin at 15.3 percent and 2.7 percent respectively. Further, usage of other sources of fuel was below one percent.

## 15.0 Sources of Fuel for Heating

Regarding the source of fuel for heating of space, the majority of the households (70.1 percent) in Kweneng East used wood, followed by the electricity grid at 25.8 percent. Furthermore, as it was the case with fuel for lighting and cooking, use of other sources of fuel was marginal.


