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# **Preface**

This is the seventh report produced by Statistics Botswana on Crime statistics. The report presents findings of the 2015 decided criminal cases from all Magistrates Courts in Botswana.

The report is based on data obtained from all twenty three magisterial courts and two regional offices in Botswana. The analysis is only focused on decided criminal cases and excludes other cases such as civil and matrimonial cases and all pending cases. The crime classification used in the analysis of the data was adopted from the Irish Crime classification and adapted for the Botswana situation. Data was sourced electronically from the Case Information Management System (CIMS), located at the Gaborone High Court, it was then edited, coded, and tabulated then analysed and the report produced.

This Report has an introductory background followed by discussion of findings, conclusion, tables and crime classification schedule appended at the end. For analysis, offences were classified into broader Crime Classifications as follows; homicide, sexual, threat to murder, dangerous or negligent acts, kidnapping, robbery, burglary, theft and related offences, fraud, controlled drugs, weapons and explosives, damage to property, public order and other social code, road and traffic, offences against government and justice procedures and then offences not elsewhere classified category.

I would like to acknowledge and appreciate the contributions of the Administration of Justice for providing data for the production of this report.

Statistics Botswana intends to improve on the coverage of this report and feedback is most welcome.

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### 1.0 **Introduction**

This report is published annually by the Crime and Vital Statistics Unit of Statistics Botswana. The data analyzed is extracted from the Case Information management System (CIMS) of the Administrative of Justice. The report currently highlights only decided criminal cases attended to by Magistrate Courts in the year 2015. The Magistracy performs a very pivotal role in the Judiciary of this country. The Magistrates try the bulk of the offences committed in this country and they handle the bulk of common disputes between ordinary citizens of Botswana.

The following services are obtainable at the Magistrates Courts:

- Family related cases such as paternity and maintenance orders
- Adoption of children
- Restraining orders in domestic violence cases
- Civil suits; here individuals sue others for non-payment of debts, breach of contracts, etc.
- Motion Court
- Criminal trials- Magistrates Courts hear the bulk of criminal cases such as rape, robbery, theft, assault
  etc.

It should however be noted that this report currently restricts itself to the analysis of criminal cases tried in these courts. Data is received from the High Court in electronic format, edited, offences categorised according to the adopted Crime Classifications and court case statistics reports produced yearly. Magisterial Courts are categorized into two regions as follows:

- 1. The Southern region comprises of Broadhurst , Village, Extension II, Ramotswa, Lobatse, Jwaneng, Mochudi, Kanye, Molepolole, Hukuntsi, Tsabong, and Gantsi Magisterial Courts.
- 2. The Northern region includes Francistown , Selibe- Phikwe, Bobonong, Mahalapye, Serowe, Palapye, Letlhakane, Masunga, Maun, Gumare and Kasane Magisterial Courts.

For the purpose of analysis, offences have been classified into the broad categories of: homicide, sexual, threat to murder, dangerous or negligent acts, kidnapping, robbery, burglary, theft and related offences, fraud, controlled drugs, weapons and explosives, damage to property, public order and other social code, road and traffic, offences against government and justice procedures and the offences not elsewhere classified category. These broad classifications were adopted from the Irish Crime Classification.

The Principal Offence Rule was not applied when analysing the data, instead, at most four (4) offences committed by the accused were used. As such the number of accused is likely to be less than the number of offences committed. The principal offence rule states that if a person commits more than one offence simultaneously, s/he is recorded only for the most serious offence and in that case the number of accused will always be equal to the number of offences committed. It is however worth noting that for some tables such as those cross tabulated by verdict or sentence only one offence has been used and that being the first in the list of offences not necessarily the most serious.

The report provides a profile and characteristics of the defendants, the verdict and sentence where applicable. It should, however, be noted that not all decided cases were initially filed in 2015, but some were brought forward from previous years and concluded or decided in the year 2015. Additionally, not all cases registered in 2015 were disposed of in the same year and as such were carried forward to the next year.

# 1.1 Coverage

Statistics Botswana (SB) analyses secondary data on criminal cases from all magisterial courts in Botswana. The data is collected by the Administration of Justice (AOJ) through the Case Information Management System (CIMS). All Magistrate Courts in the country are connected to the system that is housed at the Gaborone High Court and information on cases is entered directly into the system in real time. The data needed for statistical purposes is then extracted and given to Statistics Botswana in electronic format for analysis.

# 1.2 Challenges

Since the information collected by the Administration of Justice is meant largely for administrative purposes, some variables, crucial for statistical purposes, such as sex and age of the accused, date of initial filing, date of judgement were at times omitted. In some cases offences and verdicts were not consistently entered into the system, leading to a lengthened and cumbersome process of data cleaning, classification and coding.

### 2.0 **FINDINGS**

# 2.1 Criminal cases lodged and disposed of

In 2015 there were 3,333 cases that were brought forward from the previous year and there were 8,361 new cases lodged, making a total of 11,694 cases in that year. Of the 11,694 cases, 7,188 (61.5 percent) were disposed of and the rest were carried forward to 2016. This report is therefore, based on an analysis of the 7,188 decided cases.

### 2.2 **Trend of total accused, 2007-2015**

Chart 2 below, shows the trend distribution of decided cases from 2007 to 2015. There has been an upward trend in the number of people whose cases were decided from 2007 to 2015. However, between 2010 and 2011 there was a decrease in the number of cases that were decided or disposed of from 5,645 in 2010 to 4,720 in 2011. There was, however, a gradual increase from 4,720 in 2011 to 7,680 in 2014 followed by a slight drop to 7,188 in 2015.

# 2.3 **Decided Cases by Months**

The highest proportion (9.7 percent) of cases was decided in November, this was followed by 9.2 percent cases disposed of in March. The lowest proportion of cases disposed of was recorded in January and on average, around 8.0 percent of cases were decided or disposed of on a monthly basis.




Chart 2: Percentage Distribution of Decided Criminal Cases by Month, 2015

#### 2.4 Accused by Sex and Age

The chart 3 shows that female participation in criminal activities was lower than that of their male counterparts. Overall, males constituted 91.0 percent of the accused while females constituted only 6.0 percent and a further 3.0 per cent of the accused persons did not have their sex stated.




Chart 3: Percentage Distribution of accused by Sex, 2015

For all the age groups, male proportions were higher than female proportions. High numbers of accused were recorded from age groups 25-29, to age group 35-39, with a peak at age group 30-34 for both sexes. The year 2015 recorded 23.1 percent accused males aged 30-34, 18.7 percent aged 25-29 and 16.3 percent aged 35-39 years. The same age groups for females show higher percentages of accused when compared to other female age groups (chart 4). The findings show that the number of females accused is highest at age group 30-34 with 1.3 percent, a difference of 21.8 percentage points to their male counterparts.

Females aged 25-29 and 35-39 both recorded 1.1 percent of the accused. About 2.0 percent of the accused were males whose age was not specified as compared to 0.1 percent of their female counterparts. About 3.0 percent of the accused had neither their gender nor age stated.

The results show that crime was mostly prevalent at younger ages and decreased with the increase in age for both sexes. This trend followed the same pattern observed in earlier years for both age and sex.




Chart 4: Percentage Distribution of accused by Sex and Age group-2015

# 2.5 **Decided cases by Magistrate courts**

Of the 7,188 cases decided across all magistrates court in 2015, Extension II Magistrate court accounted for the highest percentage of accused with cases disposed of (18.5 percent) followed by the Francistown Magistrate court at 15.1 percent. The lowest was recorded at the Serowe magistrate court with less than 1.0 percent of all the cases decided in 2015.




Chart 5: Percentage distribution of decided cases within Magisterial Courts, 2015

On the other hand the percentage of decided cases differed within Magistrate Courts. While others disposed of a significant proportion of cases brought before them, others disposed of a few. The distribution of disposed cases within magistrates courts showed that Kasane magistrate court recorded the highest percentage of cases disposed of, at 81.5 percent in 2015 followed closely by Tsabong, (74.8 percent), Masunga (70.8 percent and Francistown (70.4 percent). Most of the courts disposed of between 50 and 70 percent of their cases while the lowest percent of cases disposed of was recorded in Serowe magistrate with 32.8 percent. (see chart 6)




Chart 6: Percentage decided cases by Magisterial Courts, 2015

#### 2.6 **Offences Committed**

At most four of the offences committed by an accused were analysed in this report. The findings of the report shows that the total number of offences recorded from the decided cases in 2015 was 10,121 compared to 10,807 recorded in 2014 (see Tables 6). Chart 7 below shows that Dangerous or negligent acts was the most common offence committed accounting for 23.4 percent of all the offences committed. This offence involves but not limited to dangerous driving causing serious bodily harm, over-speeding, abandoning a child, false alarm /interference with aircraft or air traffic with 18.8 percent. Unlike in the previous years, there was only one case involving kidnapping during the year 2015. A significant number of offences not elsewhere classified (12.5 percent) was recorded. Homicide constituted 1.9 percent of all decided cases, It should however be noted that though closed at magistrates courts all homicide cases are committed to the High Court for trial and final judgement.

A further segregation of the results by sex showed that of the 10,121 offences committed, 9,328 (92.2%) were committed by males while 535 (5.2%) were committed by females and 258 (2.5%) were committed by persons whose sex was not stated (Table 6). The majority of accused male persons (21.9 percent) were trialed for dangerous and negligent acts, which was followed by 17.2 percent males (1,745 persons) who were accused of theft and related offences. Similarly females trialed for dangerous and negligent acts accounted for only1.0 percent (110 persons), being the highest among females, followed by theft and related offences with 108 persons.




Chart 7: Percentage Distribution of Offences Committed, 2015

# 2.7 Accused by Age

The majority of the accused were concentrated within the youth population aged 20 - 39as shown in chart 8 and table 1 below. The chart also shows that participation in crime declines with increase in age, perhaps reflecting the myriad of challenges affecting the youth which lead them to participate in criminal activities.




Chart 8: Percentage distribution of Accused by age, 2015

Table 2.2 shows percentage distribution of offences by age of accused persons involved. The distribution reveals that youth were leading in different types of crimes with the age group 30-34 leading at 23.9 percent of total offences recorded. The results show that the accused who appeared for hearing for homicide were concentrated within age groups 20-24 up to 30-34 with age group 25-29 and 30-34 accounting for 24.7 percent each. These were followed by age group 20-24 with 16.0 percent and 35-39 accounting for 12.4 percent.

It is evident from the results that most of the offences are committed by persons aged 25-34. Highest proportions for almost all offences are recorded in these age group. It is however interesting to note that offences involving fraud , deception ,offences against government, justice procedures and organisation of crime are more prevalent among those aged 35 and above. The 20-24 years olds are more involved in cases involving sexual offences, robbery, burglary, homicide and theft and related offences accounting for more than 10 percent in each of the offences. Overall, the 65+, 60-65 and 15-19 age groups are the least in terms of crime committal, with percentages of 0.8, 1.4 and 1.0 respectively.

# 2.8 **Plea**

A total of 2,743 accused persons pleaded guilty to the charges. Out of these, 78.3 were pronounced guilty and sentenced and 3.2 percent were acquitted and discharged. Of the 3,464 who pleaded not guilty 23.4 percent were found guilty and sentenced and 21.3 percent were acquitted and discharged while a bulk of them 41.5 percent had their cases withdrawn.

#### 2.9 **Verdicts**

Chart 9 shows that 37.4 percent of the accused were found guilty and sentenced and those were followed closely by those whose cases were withdrawn accounting for 36.3 percent. The data further shows that 11.4 percent were acquitted and discharged. Some of the cases were dismissed for want of prosecution (2.7 percent) and for 10.0 percent of the accused the verdict was not stated. Those who were cautioned accounted for 0.1 percent. The remaining 2.2 percent were either committed to high court, convicted /sentence postponed or stay of proceedings.





Chart 9: Percentage distribution of verdict -2015

It should be noted that all homicide cases are not trialled at Magistrate courts but are rather closed and transferred to the High Courts. The accused for homicide cases only appear at Magistrate Courts for mention while preparations are being made to hand over to the High Courts which are mandated with dealing with such cases.

#### 2.10 Sentence

Various types of sentences are imposed depending on the seriousness of the offence and the previous criminal history of the offender.

Out of 3,234 accused who were found guilty and sentenced in 2015, the accused persons were either sentenced to; pay fines (44.7 percent), custodial (12.3 percent), corporal punishment (1.4 percent) and 15.2 percent of sentences were not specified. Other sentences include a combination of sentences as depicted in chart 10.



## 2.11 Length of time elapsed

In 2015, about 36 percent of all cases were finalised in all courts in 1-90 days (less than 13 weeks).; guilty verdicts were the most common method of finalisation in matters that took less than 13 weeks to finalise (55.5 percent). About 33 percent of cases that lasted for a period of over 3 months to a year resulted in a 32.8 percent guilty verdict pronouncement, while only 28.7 percent of cases that lasted for more than a year resulted in a guilty verdict. 


Chart 11: Percent distribution of time elapsed

### 3.0 Conclusion

During the period 2007-2015, the number of people whose cases were disposed of increased as evidenced by the upward trend distribution of accused people for this period. There has been a 38.5 percent increase in case disposal for criminal activities from 4,720 in 2011 to 7,680 in 2014. And a slight drop to 7,188 in 2015.

The distribution of offences among the different age groups shows that youths to middle aged people (ages 20-34) are relatively more prone to committing crimes than other age groups and males take dominance in all criminal activities. Overall participation in criminal activities decreases as age increases.

Conviction rates remained low with 37.3 percent of the accused found guilty. The length of time elapsed since the filing of a case to its conclusion has been found to have a bearing on the final outcome of the case. The longer it takes to conclude a case the greater the chance to have a not guilty verdict or case withdrawal probably due to loss of witnesses and or evidence.
