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Economic Statistics Summaries

Introduction

Economic Statistics


The Economic Statistics contained in this section are the most recent available at the time of preparation. The economic Statistics presented covers; National Accounts, Prices, Trade, Tourism, Agriculture, Industry, Environment, Wildlife and Transport & Infrastructure.

A brief summary is provided followed by tables and charts for each statistics area.

Gross Domestic Product (GDP)

GDP at nominal prices for 2021 is estimated at P208, 082.2 million, compared with a revised estimate of P171, 677.4 million in 2020, which is a 21.2 percent increase. At current prices, GDP per capita increased from a revised estimate of P72, 026.8 in 2020 to P86, 815.7 in 2021, which is an increase of 20.5 percent. At constant 2016 prices, GDP was estimated at P187, 585.0 million in 2021, an increase of 11.8 percent from the previous year. GDP per capita increased from P70, 630.4 in 2020 to P78, 615.2 in 2021, showing an increase of 11.3 percent in real terms.

GDP by Economic Activity


The GDP at current prices stood at P208, 082.2 million in 2021 compared to revised P171, 677.4 million in 2020, recording an increase of 21.2 percent.

Real GDP increased by 11.8 percent in 2021 compared to an 8.7 percent decrease in 2020. The increase in real GDP was mainly attributed to Diamond Traders, Mining & Quarrying and Wholesale industries which recorded an increases in real value added by 85.0, 29.8 and 14.0 percent respectively.

The increase of 29.8 percent in the real value added of the Mining industry was mainly due to the increase in the real value added of Diamond and Mining of Soda by 31.4 and 9.8 percent respectively.


Contribution to GDP by industry is shown in **table 2**. In 2021, Public Administration & Defence sector remained the major contributor to GDP at 18.0 percent followed by Mining & Quarrying, Construction and Wholesale by 15.8, 10.9 and 10.7 respectively.

Figure 2: Real Growth Rates




Consumer Price Index (CPI)

Information on Consumer Price Index is summarized on Tables (Table 6 and 7). The national year-on-year inflation rate for twelve (12) months averaged at 6.7 percent in 2021 compared to 1.9 percent recorded in the previous year (2020). The Rural villages' inflation rate grew from 10.7 percent to 13.3 percent between January and December 2021. The Cities & Towns inflation rates also increased from 10.7 to 12.3 percent, and Urban villages inflation rate went from 10.4 to 12.2 percent, during January and December 2021.




The National Consumer Price index showed an increase of 10.0 percent between January and December 2021, moving from 116.0 in January to 127.6 in December. In 2020, an increase of 8.2 percent from January to December was recorded. The cities/towns indices rose from 116.1 to 127.4, while Urban villages and Rural villages also increased from 116.2 to 127.8 and 115.4 to 127.6, respectively between January and December 2021.

Transport group Index had the highest average inflation rate in 2021 of 12.3 percent. Alcohol and Tobacco group Index followed with an annual average of 8.9 percent and the lowest inflation rate of 2021 was the Communication group Index with 1.3 percent.

Figure 5: Inflation Rates For CPI Major Components (Groups) 2021 & 2020




Mineral Production Statistics

The Mining sector is considered to be the second largest contributor to the gross domestic product (GDP) and plays a crucial role in the development of the country.

There are several mining companies which are actively operating and a few which are under care and maintenance. The operating mines produce Diamonds, Soda Ash, Salt, Coal and Gold while the ones under care and maintenance produce base metals such as Copper-Nickel-Cobalt Matter and Copper in Concentrates.

Figure 6 below indicates key minerals being produced by actively operating companies in Botswana. The year 2021 marked a turning point as all minerals were recovering from the debilitating effects of corona virus disease of 2019 (Covid – 2019).

In 2020, diamond production recorded the highest decline of 28.8 percent when compared to a decrease of 3.3 percent realised in 2019. This was followed by Gold, Soda Ash and Coal recording a decrease of 9.7, 9.7 and 8.9 percent respectively. Only Salt recorded an increase of 9.0 percent in 2020 compared to a decline of 2.2 percent recorded in 2019.


In 2021, all minerals bounced back and recorded positive growth except gold production which declined by 23.7 percent. Diamond production increased by 34.6 percent. It was followed by salt, soda ash and coal with an increase of 15.8, 9.8 and 5.1 percent respectively.

Transport 2021

Air Transport


Figure 7: International and Domestic Air Passenger Movements by years, 2012-2021

In 2021, 315,561 passenger movements were recorded, a 47.7 percent increase from 213,681 passenger movements in 2020. International arrivals went up by 37.9 percent while domestic arrivals increased by 50.9 percent. Passenger international and domestic departures also increased with 49.4 and 53.1 percent respectively, Scenic movements went up by 39.1 percent. See Figure 7.

Road Transport


Figure 8: Private Vehicle Stock 2012-2021

Private vehicle stock comprises of firstly registered vehicles and renewals. In 2021, 603,027 Total privately owned vehicles were recorded, a 6.3 percent from 567,080 vehicles recorded in 2020. Privately owned vehicles increased at an average annual rate of 5.2 percent between 2012 and 2021. **See Figure 8.**

Road Accidents


Figure 9: Accident Trend, 2012 - 2021

A total of 17,277 road accidents occurred in 2021, registering an increase of 14.6 percent from the 15,075 accidents recorded in 2020. On average road accidents went down by 0.3 percent from 2012 to 2021. The number of accidents per 1,000 vehicles went up by 8.2 percent in 2021, from 26.0 in 2020 to 28.1. Accidents per 10,000 population increased from 63.5 in 2020 to 73.6 in 2021, a 16.0 percent increase. **See Figure 9.**

Rail Transport

In 2021, goods transported through rail declined by 12.5 percent from 1,204,981 net tonnes carried in 2020 to 1,054,118 net tonnes. In the exception of local traffic, most categories of goods transported by rail decreased when compared to 2020. Total imports and total exports went down by 27.5 and 9.9 percent respectively. Local traffic increased by 14.8 percent while Botswana total decreased by 13.0 percent. Botswana origin went down by 3.4 percent. **See Figure 10**

Figure 10: Rail Goods Traffic by Direction (Net tonnes), 2012-2021




Tourist Arrivals

During 2020, Botswana received a total of 358,225 visitors, of which 91.7 percent (328, 502) were tourists while 8.3 percent (29, 723) was attributed to same-day visitors. Most visitors came from South Africa and Zimbabwe, with the two countries contributing 39.3 percent (140, 816) and 31.3 percent (112,150) respectively, of the total visitors. The majority of tourists, 90.6 percent (324, 388), resided in the SADC Region.

Tourist by Sex

The sex distribution indicates that more males than females visited the country in 2020, for both Same-day visitors and Overnight tourists. The proportion for males was relatively higher at 75.9 percent versus 24.1 percent females for Same-day visitors, and 64.8 percent males versus 35.2 percent females for Overnight tourists (Figure 11).

Purpose of Entry

Table A presents the number of tourists by purpose of entry as well as associated percentage distributions. A total of 116,662 visitors, representing 32.6 percent of overall tourists, were In Transit while Tourists accounting for 19.6 percent (70,290) came for 'Holiday/Leisure' purpose.

Those who came for purposes of 'Religious, Conferencing, Sports, Medical & Shopping activities' which are grouped together under one category called 'Other', accounted for 16.5 percent (59,239) of all tourists. In 2020, Visiting Friends and Relatives (VFR) tourists represented 11.2 percent (40,113) of all tourists.

Tourists by Mode of travel and Point of Entry

Table B presents tourists by mode of travel and Point of Entry. Tourists who entered Botswana by Road accounted for 95.9 percent (343,398), while those who flew-in represented 4.1 percent (14,827) of the total number of tourists during the year. There was no Rail travel recorded for 2020, as rail passage train transport was suspended.

The majority of tourists travelling by air, 98.5 percent (14,610) entered the country through Sir Seretse Khama International Airport followed by Maun Airport at 1.2 percent (177). Tourist arrivals through Francistown Airport accounted for 0.3 percent (40) of total tourists arriving by Air.

Majority of tourists entering Botswana by road, 20.5 percent (70,304) used the Tlokweng Border followed by 19.4 percent (66,568) entering through Ramokgwebana Border and 11.4 percent (39,051) entering through Martins Drift Border. Other border recorded less than 10% each of tourists entering Botswana through them.

Tourists by Month of Arrival

Table C display tourist arrivals by Month of Arrival. The figure depicts both day trippers and overnight tourists, but discussions are based on total monthly tourist arrivals. January recorded the highest number of tourists at 97,013 (27.1 percent), followed by February and March with 25.7 percent (92,197) and 19.4 percent (69,537) respectively. It is observed that the first quarter of 2020 recorded the highest number of inbound tourist arrivals, this is as a result of the imposition of travel ban beginning of April in response to Covid-19 pandemic. The rest of the months from April to December each recorded less than 10 percent, with April recording the lowest tourists of 1.4 percent (5,165).



All Travellers by Purpose of Entry


Figure 12: Percentage Distribution of Arrivals by Purpose of Entry – 2020

Figure 12 gives the graphical presentation of the percentage distribution of total arrivals by purpose of entry. Most of the Arrivals were In-Transit, contributing 28.1 percent (140, 522) of total Arrivals. These are followed by those who were on Business travel and those who were Visiting Friends and Relatives at 23.3 percent (116, 662) and 14.4 percent (71, 921), respectively.

In **Figure 12**, "Other1", consists of Arrivals for purposes of shopping, religious activities, conferencing, sports and medical reasons, which are not specifically labelled in the Immigration embarkation form but are understood to fall under the category "Other - specify". "Other2" comprises of students, prospective residents, diplomats, employment seekers and those who are employed.

Age Group (all travelers)

Figure 13 shows that the age group that accounted for the highest number of arrivals was 35-39 years, at 87, 630, followed by 40-44 years age group with 80, 351, accounting for 17.5 percent and 16.1 percent of all arrivals, respectively. The age group 35-39 also accounted for the highest number of departures at 91, 587 followed by those age group 40- 44 years at 83, 617; representing 17.4 percent and 15.9 percent, respectively. The lowest number of arrivals and departures were in the age group 20-24 years, being 19, 900 and 21, 600, respectively.

International Merchandise Trade Statistics

Yearly Total Trade

Imports

Imports are valued Cost, Insurance & Freight (CIF), consist of the value of the goods, costs of transport, and the cost of insurance incurred to deliver such goods to the Customs territory of the importing country, but excludes customs or any other duties paid on arrival.

The total imports of Botswana in 2021, amounted to P93, 165.3 million recording an increase of 24.9 percent (P18, 587.1 million) over a value of P74, 578.1 million during 2020. The increase was attributed to increase in all principally commodities. Diamonds was the dominant principal commodity group, having contributed 41.6 percent (P9, 589.9 million) to the overall rise in total imports. Another noticeable contribution to the overall rise was recorded for Machinery & Electrical Equipment and Chemicals & Rubber Products having contributed 23.1 percent (P1, 920.4 million) and 25.5 percent (P1, 782.6 million) to the total increase respectively.

Quarter on Quarter Comparison Imports for 2021 and 2020

During the first quarter of 2021, imports were valued at P23, 232.9, which is an increase of 31.4 percent (P5, 552.9 million) from the value of P17, 680.0 million registered during 2020 first quarter.

The Second quarter of 2021, total imports were valued P22, 412.5 million, registering an increase of 63.0 percent (P8, 661.7 million) compared to P13, 750.8 million recorded during 2020 same quarter.

Comparison of import values for the third quarter of 2021 and the same quarter of 2020 shows an increase of 11.8 percent (P2, 359.6 million) from the value of P20, 001.7 million registered during the third quarter of 2020 to the value of P22, 361.2 million recorded during 2021 third quarter.

The fourth quarter of 2021 total imports valued at P25, 158.7 million, registering an increase of 8.7 percent (P2, 013.0 million) compared to P23, 145.7 million recorded during 2020 fourth quarter.

Total Exports

Exports are valued Free On Board (FOB), i.e. there are no charges to the buyer for goods placed on board a carrier at the point of shipment (Consignment). During 2021, Botswana's total exports were valued at P82, 277.9 million, resulting in an increase of 67.5 percent (P33, 162.3 million) compared to the value of P49, 115.6 million during 2020. The increase is mainly attributed to a 71.2 percent (P30 825.0 million) increase in Diamonds exports from P43, 304.5 million during 2020 to P74, 129.5 million during 2021. The other commodity group that registered significant increase is Copper with a more than 100 percent (P926.6 million) from P298.7 million during 2020 to P1, 225.3 million in 2021.

Quarter on Quarter Comparison Total Exports for 2021 and 2020

The quarter on quarter comparison for total exports during 2021 and 2020 shows that the first quarter of 2021 recorded an increase of 76.5 percent (P10, 477.7 million) from P13, 701.2 million recorded during the first quarter of 2020 to P24, 178.2 million during the same quarter in 2021.

Comparison of the second quarters of 2021 and that of 2020 shows an increase of more than 100.0 percent (P12, 854.9 million) from the value of P4, 443.1 million recorded during 2020 second quarter to P17, 298.1 million registered during the same quarter in 2021.

During the third quarter of 2021, total exports were valued at P21, 859.9 million registering an increase of 62.3 percent (P8, 391.6 million) when compared to P13, 468.3 million recorded during the third quarter of 2020.

Total exports valued at P18, 941.7 million during the fourth quarter of 2021 shows an increase of 8.2 percent (P1, 438.8 million) compared to the value of P17, 502.9 million registered during the fourth quarter of 2020.

Trade Balance

During 2021, Botswana recorded a trade deficit of P10, 887.4 million compared to P25, 462.5 million trade deficit that was recorded in 2020.





Figure 14 which is based on Table 1.1, gives the graphical presentation of components of total trade from 2018 to 2021. It is evident from this graph that Botswana recorded trade surplus during 2018 and trade deficit over the next 3 (three) years. Trade deficit was largest 2020.

Social Statistics

Introduction

The Social Statistics section provides a comprehensive and detailed statistical overview of Botswana's population, Health, Education, Poverty and Labour. The section gives a detailed picture for each statistics area covered in the form of text, tables and graphs.

Health

Admissions in health facilities have realized a slight decrease of 2 percent in 2020 from the 174, 212 cases recorded in 2019. The proportions of the deceased to the admissions in health facilities have generally declined over time. The percentage of patients who died while admitted has consistently dropped from 4.1 percent in 2010 to 2.8 percent in 2020, which can be attributed to improved patient management at hospitals.

Figure 15: Number of Admissions, Discharged Alive and Deceased (Excl. Neonates), 2010 - 2020





Figure 16 shows the occupancy rate and average length of stay between 2010 and 2020 in Botswana. There has been generally an increase over the period under review for both the bed occupancy rate and average length of stay, with a step decrease in average length of stay in 2016 and 2017. The bed occupancy rate stood at 67 percent while average length of stay stood at 7 days. The figure further shows that occupancy rate have generally been fluctuating over the years ranging from 71.0 percent (the highest) in 2010 to 53.9 percent the lowest in 2014. The average length of stay has also been fluctuating, ranging from 7.3 days (highest) in 2019 and 2020 to 6.6 days (lowest) in 2016. Since 2016 bed occupancy rate and the average length of stay have been increasing steadily.


Figure 16: Trends in Occupancy rate and average length of stay: 2010-2020



The Figure below shows the frequency of total births, New borns and Born before Arrival (BBA) 2010-2020. There were 58 146 Institutional live births registered in 2020, an increase of 11.4% of all Institutional births registered in 2019.

The following figure illustrates the frequency of total births, newborns, and Born Before Arrival (BBA) cases from 2010 to 2020. According to the report, there were 52,206 institutional live births registered in 2019, and this number increased to 58,146 in 2020, representing an 11.4% rise in institutional live births compared to 2019.

VITAL STATISTICS


Vital statistics provide crucial and critical information on the population of a country. Vital records created through a civil registration system have two classes of use. They have value individually as legal documents for the persons named therein; they also constitute the input, when aggregated, for the various vital statistics measures that are used to study the demographics and health of populations and population subgroups

Vital statistics are compiled using Birth, death and marriage data obtained from the department of Civil and National Registration (CNR). The data is used to produce fertility, mortality and nuptial indicators

BIRTHS

Birth registration has increased over the years, rising from 40,856 in 2012 to 58,646 in 2020, a 43 percent increase over the period under review (Figure 18).

Figure 18: Current Birth registration 2012- 2020




A total of 77,070 births (live and stillbirths) were registered in 2020, out of which about a quarter were occurrences from the previous years. From the total registered, 59,480 were current occurrences of which 834 were stillbirths.

Botswana has attained 100 percent birth registration in 2018. The sex ratio at birth indicates that there are about 101 male births per a 100 female births. Only 15.8 percent of births were of married mothers. The mean age of the mother at birth stands at about 28 years and 99.8 percent of all registered births occurred in health facilities.

DEATHS

Figure 19 shows that the number of deaths registered declined from 13,185 in 2019 to 12,219 in 2020, a decline of 966 deaths. The sex ratio at death has also declined from 107 in 2019 to 104 in 2020, indicating that there were 104 male deaths per 100 female deaths in 2020. The crude death rate declined from 5.7 to 5.2 per a thousand population from 2019 to 2020. The decline in deaths can be attributed to the precautionary measures that were taken by the government to curb the spread of COVID 19 pandemic. The measures included wearing of masks, restricted movements etc.

MARRIAGES

There were 6,518 marriages solemnized in 2020 an increase of 6.9 percent from the previous year. About 0.3 percent of the brides were below 21 years, which requires consent from parents or guardians as per the marriage act. About 90 percent of marriages were between partners who were both marrying for the first time. The median age at first marriage is 40 for males and the comparable figure for females is around 35 years.

Table E shows that in about a quarter (22.4 percent) of unions, grooms were 10 or more years older than their brides were.


