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1. INTRODUCTION

This Stats Brief presents a summary of the latest Transport and Infrastructure Statistics for Quarter4 of 2014, which contains data from the months of October to December 2014. It consists of four sections, which are as follows:

- Air Transport
- Motor Vehicle Registrations
- Railway Transport
- Water Transport

In the Air Transport section, there are aircraft and air passenger movements, while the section on Motor Vehicles Registrations contains motor vehicle first registrations and license renewals. The Railway Transport section highlights statistics on the quantity of goods carried by rail and revenue generated from the conveyance of those goods. Water Transport section shows movement of vehicles and passengers who use the Pontoon to cross the Zambezi River to and from Zambia, Democratic Republic of Congo and Angola. The data reported on this quarterly brief is based on calendar year.

2. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

2.1 Air Transport

The air transport section looks at aircraft and passenger movements in Q4 2014 both locally and internationally. The movements are classified into scheduled, non-scheduled and private movements which are further classified into Arrivals and Departures. Scheduled aircraft movements are those movements which commercial aircrafts operate on a timetable, while non-scheduled aircraft movements are commercial aircraft movements that operate as and when needed. Private aircraft movements are those movements are those movements are those movements of aircrafts owned by individuals.

2.1.1 Aircraft Movements

During the quarter under review a total of 19,100 aircraft movements were recorded, which is a 23.2 percent decline in aircraft movements recorded in the previous quarter, where 24,870 aircraft movements were recorded. Compared to Q4 2013, there was a decrease of 12.3 percent from 21,769 movements. The data shows that from 2012 to 2014, Q1 had the least number of aircraft movements. This is because tourists frequent the country between the months of June and October, which are the months that fall within Q2 – Q4. The hunting season falls within Q2 and Q4 because that is when wild animals come out when it is cooler. See Table 1.

2.1.1.1 Aircraft Movements by Type of Movement

Just like in the previous quarters, domestic movements dominated in aircraft movements. Out of the 19,100 total aircraft movements recorded in Q4 2014, domestic movements contributed 75.8 percent of the movements and the remaining 24.2 percent were international movements.

Compared to the preceding quarter, Q3 2014, both International and domestic movements recorded a decline in aircraft movements. International movements fell by 13.9 percent from 5,369 movements in Q3 2014 to 4,622 movements in Q4 2014, while domestic movements declined by 25.8 percent from 19,501 movements in Q3 2014 to 14,478 movements in Q4 2014.

When comparing Q4 2014 aircraft movements to Q4 2013 aircraft movements, international movements increased by 1.9 percent while domestic movements decreased by 16.0 percent. See Table 1

During this quarter, Q4 2014, non-scheduled movements contributed 75.7 percent of the total aircraft movements whereas scheduled and private movements contributed 20.4 percent and 4.0 percent respectively. This was a decline for all the types of flights when compared to the previous quarter, Q3 2014. Non – scheduled movements declined by 27.0 percent, scheduled movements fell by 6.4 percent while private movements declined by 16.4 percent. Compared to Q4 2013, in Q4 2014, scheduled movements declined by 3.3 percent, while non-scheduled movements decreased by 15.4 percent and private movements increased by 14.8 percent.

Non-scheduled flight type is the most common type of aircraft movement. The least number of aircraft movements for the non-scheduled flight type during the past two years (2013 – 2014) is recorded in Q1 of each year. Quarter 3 recorded the highest number of non-scheduled aircraft movements. See Table 2

Scheduled arrivals and scheduled departures contributed 10.2 percent each to the total aircraft movements. Non-scheduled arrivals and non-scheduled departures each contributed 37.8 percent of the total aircraft movements. Sixty- two (62.2) percent of the international aircraft movements were scheduled; 31.0 percent of these being arrivals and 31.2 percent being departures. Non-scheduled movements made up 89.5 percent of domestic movements of which 44.6 percent were arrivals and 44.8 percent were departures. See Table 3 above.

2.1.1.3 Aircraft Movements by Airport and Month

More than half of the aircraft movements (59.4 percent) were recorded at the Maun airport and 37.6 percent of these were recorded during the month of October. Gaborone airport came second with 21.2 percent of all the aircraft movements recorded during the quarter under review and most of these were recorded during the month of October (36.3 percent). The bulk of international movements were recorded at Gaborone airport and the bulk of the domestic movements were recorded in Maun. During the quarter under review, Gaborone contributed 62.4 percent of the total international movements and Maun contributed 72.4 percent of the total domestic movements. In 2013 Ghanzi did not have any international movements; it only started having them in 2014 and compared to other airports it contributed 0.1 percent of the total international movements.

All the airports recorded a decrease in aircraft movements when compared to the previous quarter, Q3 2014. This decrease was experienced by both the international and domestic movements for all the airports except for S/Phikwe airport which recorded an increase of 12.3 percent in domestic movements.

Compared to Q4 2013, Gaborone, Maun, F/Town and Ghanzi airports recorded an increase in International movements and a decrease in domestic movements. Kasane and Selibe Phikwe airports recorded a decrease in international movements and an increase in domestic movements. This is all shown in Table 5.

2.1.2 Air Passenger Movements

During this quarter, Q4 2014, a total of 186,820 passenger movements were recorded. This was a decrease of 11.0 percent when compared to the 209,860 movements recorded in the previous quarter, Q3 2014. Passenger movements decreased by 6.6 percent when compared to the same quarter of the previous year. As is the case with aircraft movements, Q1 records the least number of air passenger movements. See Table 6 below.

2.1.2.2 Air Passenger Traffic by Quarter & Type of Flight

Scheduled passenger movements made 75.0 percent of total air passenger movements recorded during Q4 2014, while non-scheduled and private movements contributed 23.6 percent and 1.4 percent respectively. When compared to the previous quarter scheduled movements decreased by 7.2 percent, while non-scheduled movements decreased by 22.2 percent. Private movements increased by 19.0 percent.

When compared to Q4 2013 Private movements recorded an increase of 25.9 percent while scheduled and non – scheduled decreased by 6.6 and 7.9 percent respectively. **See Table 7**.

2.1.2.3 Air Passenger Traffic by Airport

Gaborone airport recorded the highest number of passenger movements in Q4 2014; it contributed 51.0 percent of all the total air passenger movements. The movements decreased by 1.9 percent when compared to the previous quarter, Q3 2014. Maun airport had the second highest number of passenger movements; it constituted 31.9 percent of the total passenger movements which was a 15.2 percent decrease when compared to the previous quarter. All the Airports but Ghanzi recorded a decrease in passenger movements when compared to the same quarter of the previous year, Q4 2013. Gaborone recorded a decline of 8.0 percent, while passenger movements for Maun, Kasane, Francistown, S/ Phikwe and Ghanzi fell by 2.5, 10.7, 5.4, and 29.3, percent respectively. Ghanzi airport recorded an increase of 2.4 percent. See Table 8 below.

Fifty – one (51.0) percent of the total passenger movements came from Gaborone and of these movements 94.9 percent were scheduled. Selibe Phikwe and Ghanzi did not record any Scheduled movements. Fifty point eight (50.8) percent of air passenger movements registered in Maun were non-scheduled, which is 68.6 percent of all the non-scheduled movements. Eighty six point four (86.4) percent of the total passenger movements recorded in S/Phikwe were Private and 13.6 percent were non-scheduled. See Table 9.

2.2. Motor Vehicle Registration

This section deals with First Registration and Renewal of motor vehicle licenses for Q4 2014.

2.2.1. Motor Vehicle First Registrations

Vehicles that are being registered for the first time are referred to as first registrations. These vehicles may not be necessarily brand new, they could have been pre-owned. First registration is a once off operation for each vehicle, and is then followed by renewals which are done annually for a fee, until the vehicle is no longer in use.

2.2.1.1 Motor Vehicle First Registration by Quarter & Type

During Q4 2014, 11,740 vehicles were registered, 72.6 percent of these were passenger cars and 9.8 percent were Vans.

When compared to the same quarter of the previous year, first registrations increased by 5.2 percent from 11,155 vehicles registered in Q4 2013 to 11,740 vehicles registered in Q4 2014. Compared to the previous quarter, there was an increase of 4.7 percent in first registrations from 11,211 vehicles in Q3 2014 to 11,740 Vehicles in Q4 2014. See Tables 10 & 11.

2.2.1.2 First Registrations by Station

First registrations are done only at DRTS offices. These first registrations include both brand new and preowned vehicles. 2.2.2 Motor Vehicle Renewals

2.2.2.1 Motor Vehicle Renewals by Quarter & Type

Motor vehicle renewals increase every year and from quarter to quarter. During this quarter, Q4 2014, a total of 110,278 vehicles had their licences renewed. Passenger cars constituted 59.2 percent of the renewals while vans constituted 23.7 percent of the total renewals this quarter. Motor cycles contributed the least number of renewals with only 0.3 percent. When compared to the previous quarter, Q3 2014 renewals increased by 10 percent. When compared to Q4 2013 renewals in Q4 2014 increased by 8.9 percent.

2.2.2.3 Motor Vehicle Renewals by Station

Most of the renewals done during the quarter under review were done in the Southern District (43.8 percent). Central District was second, contributing 16.7 percent of the total renewals done during Q4 2014. The district with the least number of renewals was Chobe District with 1.3 percent. Passenger cars dominated in Southern district, contributing 61.2 percent, while vans came second with 20.9 percent of each category. See Table 17 below and Tables 18 – 20.

Gaborone recorded 80 percent of the renewals done in the southern district, and 62.6 percent of these were passenger car. Lobatse contributed 7.4 percent of the licences renewed in Southern District.

Toyota had the highest number of renewals (47.8 percent), 62.5 percent of these renewals were passenger cars. Massey Ferguson tractor contributed 51.2 percent of all the registered tractors during the quarter under review. See Table 21 above.

2.3. Rail Transport

Rail Transport deals with goods transported by rail and the revenue generated from the conveyance of those goods.

2.3.1. Goods Traffic

Total Traffic is derived from adding Botswana Total to Transit Traffic (Transit traffic are goods that pass through Botswana to other countries). Botswana Total refers to total imports plus Botswana Origin (Botswana Origin is total exports plus local traffic). Total imports are goods transported into Botswana, total exports are goods transported to outside Botswana, and local traffic refers to goods transported within Botswana.

In Q4 2014 a total of 442,576 net tonnes were transported by rail, contributing 24.1 percent of the total goods traffic recorded in 2014. This was a decrease of 11.1 percent compared to the previous quarter, Q3 2014. In Q1 2014 imports from the north were 753 net tonnes, only to increase in Q2 and Q3, and then the imports went down again from 7,626 net tonnes in Q3 to 2,554 net tonnes in Q4. The fluctuation is due to the demand of goods in the country. Compared to imports from the South, imports from the north fluctuate more. This is shown in Table 22.

2.3.2 Revenue

Imports, Exports, Local Traffic and Transit Traffic have fluctuated over the years with Transit Traffic recording the lowest Revenue each time.

A total of P77, 076,000 revenue was generated during Q4 2014. Botswana Origin contributed 59 percent of revenue, while revenue from imports made 34.9 percent and exports contributed 43.4 percent to revenue.

The revenue decreased by 6.4 percent when compared to the previous quarter, Q3 2014. It increased by 0.2 percent when compared to the same quarter of the previous year. See Table 24.

2.4 Water Transport

Kazungula Ferry provides a gateway to countries in the north mainly, Angola, Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), Zambia and Zimbabwe.

2.4.1 Kazungula Pontoon Passengers

The Pontoon is mostly used by foreigners (83.8 percent), while Batswana only constitute 16.2 percent. For both foreigners and Batswana there are more departures than arrivals. In contrast Q1 2014 recorded more arrivals than departures, which seems to be the trend because in Q1 2013, more people arrived rather than departed. A total of 109,481 passengers used the pontoon during Q4 2014. This is a decrease of 13.8 percent when compared to the previous quarter. When compared to the same quarter of the previous year a 10.2 percent decrease was recorded.

The highest number of passengers for Q4 2014 was recorded in the month of December, contributing 42.8 percent of the total pontoon passengers. See Table 26.

2.4.2 Kazungula Pontoon Transportation of Vehicles

A total of 13,274 vehicles were transported using the pontoon during Q4 2014. This is a decrease of 0.6 percent compared to vehicles transported in the previous quarter. When compared to the same quarter of the previous year, this was an increase of 13.3 percent. The bulk of the vehicles transported by the Pontoon were those leaving the country (65.7 percent), and 34.3 percent were getting into the country.

Most of the vehicles were transported in December contributing 38.5 percent of the total vehicles. The month of October had the highest number of vehicles being transported out of the country (63.9 percent). See Table 27.
