1. INTRODUCTION

This Stats Brief presents a summary of the latest Transport and Infrastructure Statistics for Quarter 2 of 2016, which contains data from the months of April to June.

This brief consists of four sections, which are as follows;

- Air Transport
- Motor Vehicle Registrations
- Railway Transport
- Water Transport

Air transport section covers aircraft and air passenger movements, while the section on Motor Vehicles Registrations contains motor vehicle first registrations and license renewals. Railway Transport section highlights statistics on quantity of goods carried by rail and revenue generated from the conveyance of those goods. Water transport shows movement of vehicles and passengers who use the Pontoon to cross the Zambezi River to and from Zambia, DRC and Angola. The data reported on this quarterly brief is based on calendar year.

2. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

2.1 Air Transport

Air Transport looks at both domestic and international movements made by aircrafts and passengers. International movements herein refers to movements made by aircrafts and passengers to destinations outside Botswana borders, whilst domestic movements accounts for travels made within Botswana boarders. These movements are further classified into scheduled, non-scheduled and private movements where scheduled movements are those movements that follow a time table and are usually commercial, while non-scheduled refer to movements which do not follow a time table but operate as and when needed, yet also commercial. Private Aircrafts movements refer to non-commercial movements, the aircrafts are usually individually owned.

2.1.1 Aircraft Movements

For Q2 2016, 75.3 percent of the movements were domestic movements. Both international and domestic movements recorded an increase in aircraft movements; international movements increased by 13.7 percent while domestic movements increased by 38.9 percent when compared to the previous quarter, Q1 2016. There was a total increase of 31.6 percent in aircraft movements during Q2 2016, when compared to the previous quarter. Q2 2016 realized a total increase of 5.6 percent when compared to Q2 of the previous year, 2015. See **Table 1**.

2.1.1.1 Aircraft Movements by type of Flight

During Q2 2016, 20,343 aircraft movements were recorded and 74.8 percent of these movements were non – scheduled. Scheduled and private movements recorded 21.6 percent and 3.6 percent respectively. All movements recorded an increase in aircraft movement when compared to the previous quarter, Q1 2016; scheduled movements increased by 2.0 percent while non – scheduled and private movements increased by 43.6 percent and 32.7 percent respectively. Compared to Q2 2015, scheduled and non-scheduled movements recorded an increase in aircraft movements, they increased by 8.3 percent and 6.0 percent respectively while private movements decreased by 15.1 percent. Details are shown in **Table 2**.

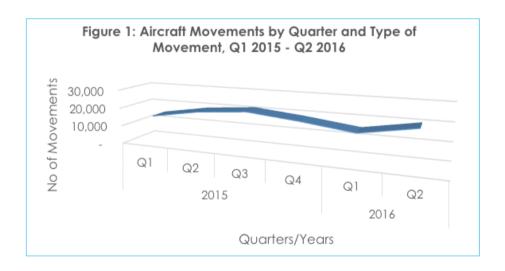

Arrivals made 50.1 percent of scheduled aircraft movements and the remaining 49.9 percent were departures. Whereas with non-scheduled aircraft movements, 50.1 percent of the movements were departures and the remaining 49.9 percent were arrivals. Scheduled arrivals contributed 32.2 percent to the total international movements and 3.8 percent of the total domestic movements. See **Table 3.**

2.1.1.3 Aircraft Movements by Airport and Month

The months of April, May and June contributed 30.0 percent, 35.5 percent and 34.6 percent of the total aircraft movements respectively. The majority of the aircraft movements (58.8 percent) were recorded in Maun and 30.0 percent of those were recorded during the month of April, while May recorded 35.8 percent and June recorded 34.2 percent of aircraft movements made in Maun. Gaborone was second with 21.7 percent. S/ Phikwe recorded the least number of aircraft movements contributing only 0.1 percent. See **Table 4**.

Compared to the previous quarter, Q1 2016, all but S/Phikwe and Ghanzi airports recorded an increase in aircraft movements. Gaborone recorded an increase of 1.4 percent, Maun recorded an increase of 41.3 percent, Kasane recorded an increase of 62.9 percent, and Francistown recorded an increase of 24.2 percent, while Ghanzi and S/Phikwe airports declined by 25.5 percent and 55.3 percent respectively. This is shown in **Table 5.**

2.1.2 Air Passenger Movements

During Q2 2016, a total of 193,457 passenger movements were recorded, which was an increase of 21.3 percent from 159,256 passenger movements done in Q1 2016. Fifty six point three (56.3 percent) of these movements were international and the remaining 43.7 percent were domestic passenger movements. Compared to the same quarter of the previous year, Q2 2015, International movements recorded an increase of 7.3 percent while domestic movements increased by 8.5 percent. **See Table 6** below

2.1.2.1 Air Passenger Movement by Quarter and type of Flight

Despite the fact that non-scheduled aircraft movements dominated, more passengers are found in the scheduled movements. Scheduled passenger movements contributed 76.4 percent of the total movements while non – scheduled and private contributed 23.0 percent and 0.6 percent respectively. Scheduled and non-scheduled movements recorded an increase in air passenger movements when compared to the previous quarter, Q1 2016; non-scheduled movements increased by 44.9 percent, scheduled movements increased by 16.0 percent. Private movements declined by 21.5 percent.

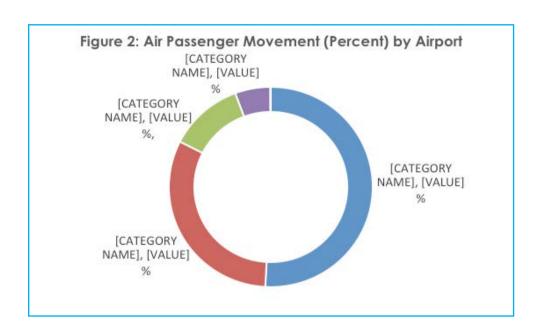
Compared to Q2 2015, scheduled and non-scheduled movements still recorded an increase in air passenger movements. Scheduled movements went up by 9.7 percent, non - scheduled increased by 6.0 percent. Private movements recorded a decrease of 57.2 percent. See **Table 7**.

2.1.2.3 Air Passenger Movement by Airport

Gaborone recorded 50.9 percent of total passenger movements, which was an increase of 7.4 percent when compared to Q1 2016. Maun recorded 31.6 percent, Kasane recorded 11.8 percent, Francistown 5.6 percent, while Selibe Phikwe and Ghanzi recorded 0.02 and 0.03 percent respectively. The bulk of international passenger movements were recorded at Gaborone airport, making 70.4 percent of total international passenger movements. Gaborone, Maun, Kasane and Francistown recorded an increase in both international and domestic movements when compared to the previous quarter Q1 2016. See **Table 8 and Figure 2**.



2.1.2.4 Air Passenger Movement by Airport and Type of Flight

The highest number of scheduled passenger movements were recorded in Gaborone (64.2 percent), Maun recorded 20.9 percent, Kasane 7.9 percent and Francistown 7.0 percent. Selibe Phikwe and Ghanzi airport did not have any scheduled passenger movements. The bulk of non-scheduled passenger movements were made at Maun airport (68.0 percent), while a high number of private passenger movements were recorded in Gaborone (75.1 percent). See **Table 8 and 9**.

2.2. Motor Vehicle Registration

Motor vehicle registrations deals with first registrations (that is vehicles that are being registered for the first time) and renewals.

2.2.1. Motor Vehicle First Registrations

First registered vehicles can be brand new, used or re-built and these are only captured at Departments of Road Traffic and Safety (DRTS).

2.2.1.1 Motor Vehicle First Registration by Quarter and Type

The number of vehicles in the country have been increasing at the average rate of 9.4 percent for the past 10 years. First registrations have increased by 136.8 percent since 2006; they stood at 46,045 in 2015 from 19,442 registered in 2006. On quarterly basis, the data shows that as we proceed into the year the number of acquired vehicles increases; both years 2014 and 2015 show that first registrations increased from quarter to quarter.

During the quarter under review, 12,471 vehicles were registered for the first time, which is an increase of 19.3 percent when compared to the previous quarter Q1, 2016. When compared to the same quarter of the previous year, first registrations increased by 14.6 percent. The majority of vehicles registered for the first time were passenger cars (74.3 percent), this were followed by Vans (10.1 percent). Trucks registered for the first time made 5.3 percent, while buses and trailers both made 3.8 percent each. The types of vehicles which contributed the least to first registrations were the tankers/horses and tractors.

First registrations in Q2 2016 increased by 14.6 percent when compared to the same quarter in 2015 from 10,885 vehicles to 12,471 vehicles. See **Table 10**.

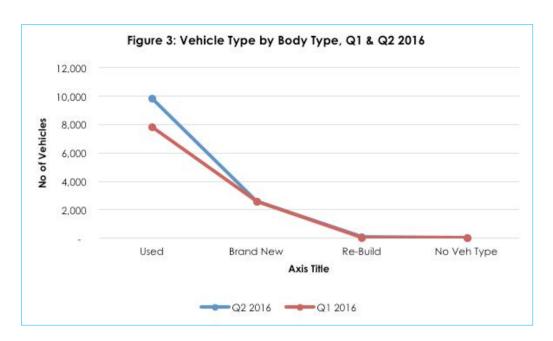

Most of the vehicles registered for the first time were used vehicles (78.8 percent), this were followed by brand new vehicles (20.6 percent, while rebuilt vehicles made only 0.6 percent of first registrations. The bulk of used vehicles registered for the first time were passenger cars (85.3 percent). See **Table 11**.

The bulk of the vehicles registered for the first time came from Japan (69.2 percent), South Africa followed with 21.5 percent. Singapore and Botswana followed with 4.3 and 2.7 percent respectively. Japan registered the highest number of used vehicles constituting 87.3 percent of the total used vehicles. Most of the brand new vehicles were from South Africa constituting 86.2 percent of the total brand new vehicles. See **Table 12**.

2.2.2.3 Motor Vehicle Renewals by Station

Cities and Towns, contributed 53.6 percent to the total vehicle renewed in Q2 2016. Gaborone registered 34.6 percent of total renewals, and contributed 64.5 percent of the renewals done in cities and towns, Sowa recorded the least number of the renewals for Cities and Towns just like in the previous quarter Q1 2016. Cities and Towns were followed by Kweneng district with 13.7 percent, the Central district followed with 11.4 percent. The district with the least number of renewals was North East with 0.8 percent of the total renewals.

In the Southern District, 3,584 renewals were made and out of those renewals 2,281 were recorded in Kanye. Kanye contributed 63.6 percent of the renewals for the Southern District. In the Kgatleng District, most of the renewals were done in Mochudi (88.7percent). See **Table 19**.

2. 2.3. Rail Transport

Rail Transport looks at goods transported by rail and the revenue generated from the conveyance of these goods.

2.3.1. Goods Traffic

Total Traffic is made up of Botswana Total and Transit Traffic (transit traffic are goods that are en-route through Botswana to other countries). Botswana Total are made up of Total Imports and Botswana Origin. Goods referred to as Botswana origin are made up of total exports and local traffic.

During the quarter under review, a total of 444,066 net tonnes were transported using rail. When compared to the previous Quarter, Q1 2016, this was a decrease of 35.2 percent. When compared to Q2 2015, this was a decrease of 6.9 percent. In Q2 2016, Imports from South went up by 7.0 percent while Imports from the North went down by 91.1 percent. Total exports decreased by 4.5 percent. An increase of 81.9 percent was realized in Local traffic, while Botswana Origin increased by 11.8 percent. Botswana Total went up by 7.5 percent and Transit traffic went down by 89.7 percent. See **Table 23.**

Most of the goods were transported during the month of May (34.8 percent). The same quantity of goods were transport during April and May, 32.6 percent each. See **Tables 24**.

2.3.2 Revenue

Revenue has been increasing at an average rate of 11.7 from 2005 to 2015.

Q2 2016 recorded a 0.9 percent increase in revenue compared to Q1 2016 from P76 million to P77 million. Compared to the same quarter of the previous year, Q2 2015, a decrease of 3.7 percent was recorded. Despite the fact that revenue realized from Imports from North went down, revenue from Total Imports increased by 7.4 percent. Revenue realized from Local Traffic increased by 47.4 percent, while revenue from Botswana Origin and Botswana Total increased by 0.8 and 3.3 percent respectively. See Table 25.

April contributed 33.7 percent of the total revenue generated during this quarter, Q2 2016, while May and June contributed 35.7 and 30.6 percent respectively. Total Revenue then increased by 5.7 percent during the month of May and decreased by 14.3 percent in June. See **Table 26**.

2.3.2 Rail Passengers

The passenger train was terminated in April 2009 and only to be reinstated in April 2016. Table 27 below shows that since its reinstatement, 26,031 passengers have used the train generating revenue of P2, 204,000.

The train carried more passengers (34.3 percent) in June than during the other two months. Even though that is the case most of the revenue was generated in May, contributing 45.4 percent of the total revenue generated that quarter. See **Table 27.**

2.4 Water Transport

Kazungula Ferry enhances movement of people, vehicles and goods across the Zambezi River and therefore provides gateway to countries in the north mainly Angola, DRC, Zambia and Zimbabwe.

In Q2 2016, 120,943 people used the pontoon to either leave or get into the country. Out of 120,943 people 77.0 percent were foreigners, and the remaining 23.0 percent were Batswana. See **Table 28** below.

During the quarter under review, the month of June had a high number of people (35.0 percent) who travelled used the Pontoon to travel in or out of the country. In April and May 31.2 and 33.8 percent of the people used the Pontoon. See **Table 28a**.

2.4.1 Kazungula Pontoon Transportation of Vehicles

The number of vehicles transported using the Kazungula Pontoon in shown in **Table 29**. A total of 15,629 vehicles were transported using the pontoon across the Zambezi River during this quarter, Q2 2016. Fifty eight point two (58.2 percent) of these vehicles were leaving the country and 41.8 percent were entering the country. When compared to the previous quarter, Q1 2016, there was a decrease of 35.3 percent in the total number of vehicles transported by the pontoon;

Compared to Q2 2015, the number of vehicles entering the country increased by 7.8 percent and vehicles leaving the country decreased by 23.3 percent

The month of May contributed the highest number of vehicles transported by the pontoon with 34.2 percent. The months of April and June recorded 31.9 and 33.9 percent of the total vehicles transported by the pontoon in Q2, 2016.
